One of the two apartment buildings owned by Helping Hands are the Sunbrite Apartments. These apartments are for single women and single moms. Ten women and five children currently live here, many of whom have a history of emotional or physical abuse and several who have defeated heavy addictions. Since being with Helping Hands, ALL the women have been able to get jobs and are successfully getting back on their feet. One of the best things about Sunbrite is that the ladies look out for each other and encourage each other, having overcome many of the same issues! RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT



Rhonda was born to teenage parents who really never wanted her, and a mom who hated her from the very beginning. Her Aunt, who was only eleven when Rhonda was born, shared memories of her mother hitting her so hard, that she knocked her out of the high chair and on to the kitchen floor. This happened before Rhonda was even a year old. As a teenager, the mental and emotional abuse was unbearable, and she attempted suicide several times. She says, "Nobody was even paying enough

attention to me to really notice". Her mother always told her that no one would ever love her, and she believed it.

Her father remarried and had another family. He considered Rhonda "a mistake from his past." The day after she graduated from high school, her father told her that she had two weeks to get out, and she became homeless.

At age thirty, Rhonda met the father of her children. Four days after she became pregnant, he knocked her down the stairs. She felt "her entire soul and spirit collapse. Night after night, he came home and abused me in every way, and I couldn't stand up." He used her mother against her saying, "Your own mother doesn't even love you."

After having three children, Rhonda found in them a reason to stand up and find a way out.

The last time he hit her was on Valentine's Day of 2009. She still has pain and ringing in her ear as a reminder. She was able to get away and was living in a hotel in Ocala. She was down to her last few dollars and was walking with her children to Walmart to get a few groceries. She didn't know what to do after that money ran out. It began to rain, and she began to cry. She looked up to the sky and screamed, "God, where are you?" A homeless man came up to her and gave her some money. She was able to get enough groceries for one more week. Back at the hotel, the manager told her that her room was paid for the month and gave her some more food. God heard her prayer.

Rhonda heard of Helping Hands at a church rummage sale. Her money was running out again, and she decided to try one more door. She moved in to one of our apartments in September, and she is working in one of our thrift stores. She feels much better about herself, and her children are a lot more emotionally stable. Thank you for all your support in helping Rhonda and her children build a new and better life
