RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT



Lauren's stepfather was a drug addict and her mother had severe mental issues. In Ohio she grew up living in poverty and enduring a lot of verbal and physical abuse from her parents. Lauren was the oldest of 8 children and was the one who took care of everyone. At age eleven Lauren and her siblings were placed in foster care.

While in foster care she faced additional physical abuse. Thankfully

she escaped by being adopted by a family that regularly picked her up in the church bus and took her to church. Lauren said her adoption was very special ... because they were a Godly family that gave her the upbringing and love she never had.

Unfortunately later in life Lauren fell into a relationship that had continuous domestic violence by the father of her twin boys. Lauren was now living in Florida and finally had to file an injunction to escape the abusive relationship. With very little money, and nowhere to go ... her mechanic told her about Helping Hands.

Lauren called Helping Hands and after an interview she was gladly accepted into our residential program. She said Helping Hands took her and her children out of a very negative and dangerous environment, and into a safe place!

Lauren is a very kind and gracious person, a hard worker at her job, a wonderful mother and a talented gospel singer. She told us that since coming to Helping Hands her life has taken a very positive direction and has given her and her boys a peace they have not had in a long time. We are very grateful to have her and her two boys with us.
